First step: Determine if you should be completing a 101 application or a 105 application.

If you are a 101 applicant <u>and</u> you are registered with a day school, your day school will be providing the midterm marks and final marks to OUAC.

If you are a 105 applicant:

Deadline: There is no common deadline for submitting the 105 application.

Education Documents from TVO ILC

Use your TVO ILC Portal to request education documents and arrange for them to be sent to each of the universities. Only Midterm and Transcript requests are accepted at this time. Documents are being sent electronically to the institutions of your choice. Remember to include your OUAC reference number and the individual university student number in your request.

When you have completed all your TVO ILC courses, arrange for a final transcript to be sent to each of the universities to which you have applied.

Before you apply

Research the universities and post-secondary programs of interest to you by visiting www.ontariouniversitiesinfo.ca

You can take virtual tours, attend virtual events, view university videos and webinars, connect with university representatives and access other online resources. Visit each

university's Overview page and click "Get Information from Universities" to request information directly from the universities.

Ensure you will have the program prerequisites and be sure to meet the deadlines as they will vary by university and individual programs.

Ready to apply

To apply as a 101 applicant, you must first log in to your 101 application to create your OUAC account. To do this, you will need your School Number, Student Number and Temporary PIN (Personal Identification Number) which will be contained in the Application Access Code Letter provided to you by your day school. Refer to www.ouac.on.ca/101-tutorials/tutorial-1-transcript/ to walk you through this process. Once you have created your OUAC account, you may complete the application at www.ouac.on.ca/apply/secondary/en_CA/user/login

To apply as a 105 applicant, you will not need a PIN (Personal Identification Number). Refer to https://www.ouac.on.ca/guide/105-guide/ for instructions on how to apply. You may complete your application at www.ouac.on.ca/apply/nonsecondary/en_CA/user/login

Getting Help

For any application inquiry, call 519-823-1063 Monday - Wednesday and Friday: 9:30 am – 4:15 pm (ET) Thursday: 10:00 am – 4:15 pm (ET) Be sure to have your OUAC reference number ready.

A few reminders:

- Several university programs are referred to as Grades Plus programs.
 For these programs, you may need to provide additional information or complete additional steps required by the university. These could include references, profile statements, information sheets, interviews, practical tests, portfolios, auditions, etc.
- Some programs have early deadlines so it is wise to complete the application as early as possible. These deadlines will apply if you change your choices.
- After you submit your application, make changes, or accept offers of admission, you
 may not have access to your account for one to three days. This is to permit
 processing and transmission of the information to the individual universities.
- Check your email regularly for updates from your universities or the OUAC website.

Applying to other Canadian Universities outside of Ontario?

Visit <u>Universities Canada</u> for more information or contact the university directly. The OUAC processes applications for Ontario universities only.
